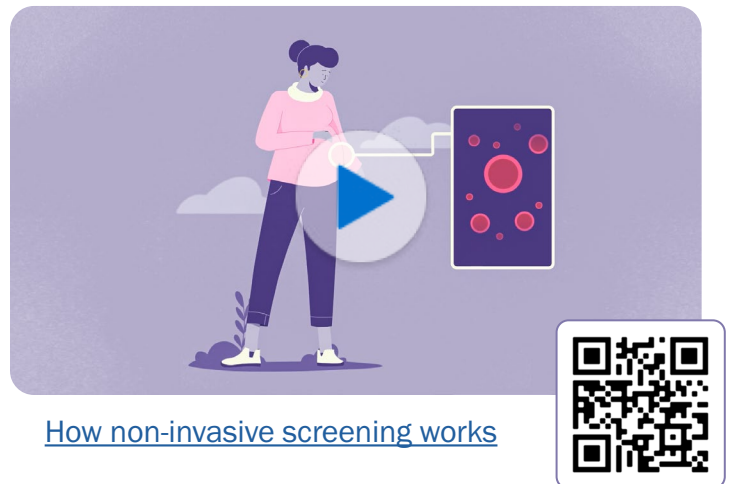
About Genetic Screening

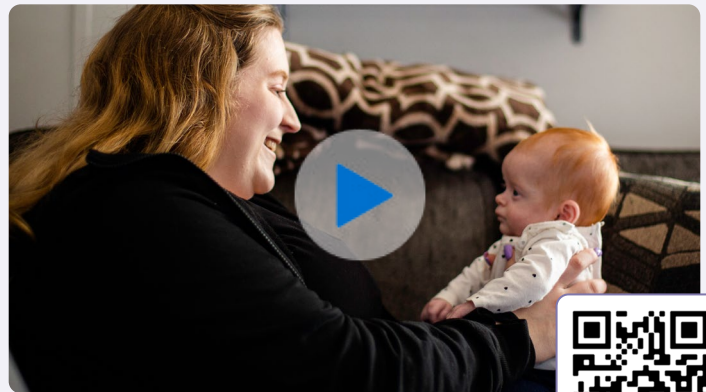
What should I ask my provider?
